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# Oliver Fried Breaks XC Course Record



On Tuesday, October 8th, senior captain, Oliver Fried, ran his last home race of his high school career. He set high goals to break the course record, which he had previously set in his junior year running the 2.6 mile course in a quick time of 14:13. It's safe to say he met and surpassed those goals. Oliver turned the corner to finish the race and the crowd went wild, in complete disbelief as the clock was at about 13:13 — one minute off the course record time. Fried crossed the finish line at 13:35, breaking his previously set record in 2018 by 38 seconds.

Coach Harte states on the cross country website “Oliver Fried left his mark in DS cross country history by breaking his own course record. Last year he set the record in 14:13; this year he shattered it by running in an astounding 13:35. Previous to last season, the record of 14:16 had stood since 2013. I think this new record will stand for many years to come.” When Oliver Fried was asked for a comment he said “I was very reassured. I was nervous if I would be able to run as fast as I did last year, where I gave it everything I had. I did not know if I could do that again, but I was trying to be confident going in. I was very happy with my performance, but obviously there are things I could have done better. It was another race under my belt to get me where I want to be in November at All States. “

The boys cross country team finished 5-0 in the TVL Small League, winning the TVL Small. The girls cross country team finished 4-1 in the TVL Small League, coming in second place in the TVL Small.
